

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NOTE TO THE INSTRUCTOR

The Weygandt Fundamentals of Intermediate Accounting Excel Workbook templates are available in two formats to meet your needs. The first format is the format found on the CD attached to this booklet. This format provides basic guidance in solving the exercises and problems and contains keys for account title placement, value placement, and formula placement. This format is intended to provide your students a structured environment to reduce the time required to accomplish the exercise or problem without reducing the educational challenge and opportunity afforded by the exercise or problem. Very few account titles and few account values are given in this format. Each student template contains an instructions worksheet and an area for the student to identify him or herself, the course, the due date, and the instructor. The exercise or problem identification is near the top of the first page of every exercise or problem. Each template is also set up with footers stating the exercise or problem identity, the page number of page numbers, and the time printed to assist in compiling the many pages you may receive.

The second template format is a "partially populated" exercise or problem format where, in addition to the standard format described above, some account titles and account values are given to the student to assist in solving the exercise or problem. These are available to you for distribution as downloads from the Weygandt Fundamentals of Intermediate Accounting, 1/e Instructor's Resources web site and Instructor's CD. This format contains the same problem presentation as the first format.

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
