

CHOOSING A CAREER

You should keep in mind that your job will help determine your future friends and the place where you will live as well as your income. In other words, your career means more than just a certain kind of work, it represents a way of life.

Another point to be aware of in choosing your career is the effect this decision has on your present life. Some people think that students who have a career in mind do better work in school than those having no plans for themselves after graduation. Others disagree and claim that students are better off if they keep an open mind and seek a broad base of knowledge before deciding on a career.

One serious problem faces you when you select a vocational goal: making the right choice for yourself. You should think carefully and make a tentative choice at first. It may develop into a permanent goal or it may not. But keep an open mind until you know more about the occupation. This will give you an opportunity to seek general knowledge before you attempt to specialize. You will find a general educational background to be useful and necessary in almost any job.

When you select an occupation, remember to select a job that you think you can do best, both for your own satisfaction and the good of all: You should choose a vocation that will be a challenge to you and yet one in which you can achieve success through your abilities.
