Grammar 1: Present perfect- Adverbs: Already, just, yet, still, ever, never

	Just	Still	Already	Yet
Usage	Talk about something happened ‘a short time ago’	Talk about something that hasn’t finished – especially when we expected it to finish earlier .	Talk about something has happened early – or earlier than it might have happened.	Talk about something which is expected to happen and it means ‘ at any time up to now ’.
Usage	between have/ has + past participle	Before have/has + past participle	between have/ has + past participle	- In questions and negatives . - usually at the end of the sentence

Example	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I've <u>just</u> seen Susan coming out of the cinema. • Mike has <u>just</u> called. Can you ring him back please? • Have you <u>just</u> taken my pen? Where has it gone? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I've been waiting for over an hour and the bus <u>still</u> hasn't come. • You promised to give me that report yesterday and you <u>still</u> haven't finished it. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I've <u>already</u> spent my salary and it's two weeks before pay day. • The train's <u>already</u> left! What are we going to do? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have you finished your homework <u>yet</u>? (The speaker expects that the homework will be finished.) • I haven't finished it <u>yet</u>. I'll do it after dinner.
EVER		NEVER		
<p>Ever means 'at any time', the specific time is unknown or unnecessary, and is used in questions.</p> <p>- Have you ever met a famous person?</p> <p>(Did you meet a famous person at any time in the past?)</p>		<p>Never is originally a contraction of 'not ever'.</p>		
<p>Ever is also used with nothing, nobody for things that haven't happened before.</p> <p>- Nobody has ever travelled through time.</p>		<p>Never means the subject hasn't had a certain experience before.</p> <p>- Have you ever been abroad? No, I've never been abroad.</p> <p>(I've never had that experience)</p>		

	before.)
<p>Ever is also used with 'the first time' for first experiences.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- <i>This is the first time I've ever eaten snake soup.</i>	<p>Never can be used in negative questions to show the surprise that you've never had a certain experience before.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- <i>Have you never played soccer?</i>

Grammar 2: Differences between present perfect and past simple

Present Perfect	Past Simple
<p>Unfinished actions that started in the past and continue to the present:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>I've known Julie for ten years (and I still know her).</i>	<p>Finished actions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>I knew Julie for ten years (but then she moved away and we lost touch).</i>
<p>A finished action in someone's life (when the person is still alive: life experience):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>My brother has been to Mexico three times.</i>	<p>A finished action in someone's life (when the person is dead):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>My great-grandmother went to Mexico three times.</i>
<p>A finished action with a result in the present:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>I've lost my keys! (The result is that I can't get into my house now).</i>	<p>A finished action with no result in the present:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>I lost my keys yesterday. It was terrible! (Now there is no result. I got new keys yesterday).</i>
<p>With an unfinished time word (this week, this month, today):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>I've seen John this week.</i>	<p>With a finished time word (last week, last month, yesterday):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>I saw John last week.</i>
